How the Activity Works



Call the AMC before you come, to register for the activity. Pick up your trail guide booklet from the AMC's Registration Office when you arrive. Read the introductory information, then open the booklet to the map in the center and visit the 18 stations on the 2.1 mile long trail. Answer

the questions as you go and at the end of the handout. Visit the office to get your certificate and, if you are staying overnight, the Children's Rlahts Game. Enjoy!

About the United Nation's Convention on the Rights of a Child



Human rights apply to all age groups. On November 20th, 1989, world leaders recognized that children needed a special Convention just for them because people under 18 often require special care and protection. To make sure that countries of the world

respect children's rights, UNICEF was named by the Convention to provide assisting expertise and to help existing governments to implement the 54 articles of the Convention such as the right to having ones own name, family, education, free time, etc. This trail adventure is designed to educate children on their rights so they can stand freely as active participants in society and advocate for their needs.
